From the Pastor's Desk

Sometimes if we are lucky we find a "diamond in the rough." It happened to me a few weeks ago while I was browsing around Barnes & Nobles and came across one of the "bargain" tables. I saw a little book entitled No Greater Love, a book about Mother Teresa. The book is divided into various topics about which Mother Teresa speaks -- prayer, love, service, giving, etc.

The last chapter is a short biography of her life. She was born in southeastern Europe in 1910, and grew up in a happy home with one brother and one sister. Her mother was very religious and would never turn anyone away from her house who needed help. Mother Teresa's given name was Agnes, and she felt her first calling to a religious and missionary life at the age of twelve.

Eventually, she felt the call to go to India and work with the poorest of the poor, which

she did.

She founded the Missionaries of Charity, which is a group of Catholic nuns who live with the poor and help care for them; today there are Missionary of Charity houses all over the world. Mother Teresa received numerous humanitarian awards like the Nobel Peace Prize in 1979.

What a joy it was to read what Mother Teresa said about various topics, especially about love, giving, service, and death and dying. In a time when many people are out to take whatever they can from life, it is refreshing to read about someone who gave herself to others. Instead of asking, "What can I get out of today?" Mother Teresa asked, "What can I do for someone else today?" On service she said: "Whatever you do, even if you help somebody cross the road, you do it to Jesus. *(Desk, continued on page 9)*

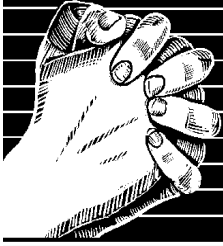
Not Just Another Jazz Band

On October 7th, we will begin our Stewardship Campaign for our ministries of the coming year. We are given the opportunity to make an estimate of how we will financially support the ministries of our church for the coming year.

This year the Finance Committee worked hard to create a conservative budget while meeting the needs of the church's programs. The 2007 budget increased by less than 1 percent or \$1,894 from last year. However, income has decreased by about \$15,000. In the campaign materials, there is information on giving by age and dollar amounts, the 2008 proposed budget, the programs we provide, and a discussion on the deficit we face.

ASC: All Stars for Jesus

The AfterSchool Club meets every Thursday from 3:15 to 4:30 at the Virginia United Methodist Church. It



is open to students in Kindergarten through Fifth Grade. This year we have a fun new curriculum entitled “All Stars for Jesus”

This is a strong Bible-based curriculum with lots of options including weekly classroom activity sheets. These sheets contain creative learning activities for Bible study and crafts that help the children remember each Bible lesson. We also read a simple easy- to- read Bible story that will help the children understand how the Bible lessons apply to their lives.

Week one’s lesson was about Thanksgiving. The Memory verse for the week was Psalm 107:1: “Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good.” The youth learned that the Israelites were happy because God brought them out of slavery from Egypt and God has done many things for us and we should be thankful.

CLICK Takes the Plunge

During the CLICK meetings on the second and third Wednesdays of the month, we are using the VBS Curriculum from this year “Take The Plunge.”

This allows us to take more time with each lesson. In September we started with plunge into obedience with The Bible story about a miraculous catch. When Jesus finished speaking, He told Simon to go further out into

the lake where the water was deeper and to lower his fishing nets (Luke 5:4). At first Simon protested that he had fished all night and caught nothing, but then said, "Nevertheless at Your word I will let down the net" (verse 5). This one part brought many questions including; “What would you do if some one told you how to do your job, and even worse, this person was not a fisherman by trade, but a carpenter?” After this miracle Simon Peter became the obedient fisher of men. This group is really breaking down the questions and giving some thought and wisdom to their answers.

OUR CHURCH COMMITTEES ARE WORKING

ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL

Pastor Bill opened the September 24, 2007 meeting with prayer. Minutes of the August 27, 2007 meeting accepted by a motion with the correction of one typo – should read “A forest re-certification is required at the farm”.

ADMINISTRATION REPORT: Motion made, seconded, and passed to accept the Finance Report as presented. The 2008 Gift Committee Budget was presented as an informational item only. The Investment Committee met with the representation from First National Bank in Beardstown and the income will remain at \$31,000. A motion was made, seconded, and passed to accept the 2008 Projected General Fund Budget.

TRUSTEES: The Trustees did not have a quorum on September 18th and a meeting has been rescheduled for September 25th. The flooring is down in the family room at the parsonage, but some detail work remains. The garage door has not yet been fixed.

STAFF/PARISH RELATIONS: The committee will meet again on October 9th to complete the pastor and church assessments and tabulate the congregational survey.

NURTURE: The Nurture Committee met on September 11th. During Sunday School Hour on October 28th, Gina Ohrn’s brother is presenting a program on Native Americans’ beliefs. Gina Ohrn would like to see a mentor program involving the high school class working with the younger classes for Fifth Sunday special programs. The Methodism 101 class began on September 16th with good attendance.

The Yapple Concert will be held on October 22 at 7:00 p.m.

Sign up is completed for the Church Directory. Olan Mills will take photos on October 5th and 6th.

Advent begins on December 2nd with the Hanging of the Greens. There will be Sunday School at 9:00 a.m. and one worship service at 10:00 a.m. Bible Study Classes will begin

November 27th and 28th with classes weekly on Tuesday evening and repeated on Wednesday morning, ending on December 19th.

Fall Youth Programs have started again.

The Education Committee will meet on October 15th. The Nurture Committee will meet again on November 13th.

AGE LEVEL MINISTRIES: Pastor/Staff Recognition Sunday to be held on October 14th. This will be a full potluck with the committee furnishing table service and the drink. The Fall Social is November 11th with the committee furnishing turkey, dressing, mashed potatoes, rolls, drinks, gravy, and table service.

PASTOR’S REPORT: Pastor Bill continues to maintain office hours, and write sermons and newsletter articles. He is making pastoral calls, and attending various Sunday School classes and committee meetings. Since the last meeting, he conducted one funeral. He attends a Tuesday morning breakfast at Vic’s in Jacksonville for area UMC Pastors and is meeting with a couple whom he will marry. He is leading a new class for anyone wishing to join our church and preparing for Charge Conference on November 4. He attends continuing education classes monthly.

October Mission Spotlight ...

Our September Mission Spotlight shines on the Midwest Mission Distribution Center (MMDC), in Chatham, Illinois.

MMDC, opened for ministry in March 2000, continues to grow in its outreach to the upper Midwest, to the entire US and out to the larger world. Volunteers are coming in large numbers to serve the church at MMDC.

Requests for shipments come on a regular basis from the US and overseas. In 2006 there were 22 shipments sent to other countries; 202 shipments were made in the US! These shipments of donated material valued at nearly \$2,000,000 was all done with the hands of volunteers! Last year 2,337 individuals from 17 different states, representing 629 churches, volunteered at the MMDC. In 2006 volunteers gave 30,721 hours.

Disaster relief materials have been sent to people recovering from floods, fires, tornadoes, and hurricanes in the US. Humanitarian aid, medical, and educational goods have been shipped to Afghanistan, Algeria, Belarus, Brazil, Costa Rica, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Ghana, Haiti, Honduras, Iraq, Liberia, Mexico, Pakistan, Panama, Peru, Romania, Russia, Sierra Leone, Tajikistan, and Zimbabwe.

At the Center volunteers pack kits, sort items, sew school bags, hospital gowns, and blankets, and box goods, among other things. The warehouse is used for storage, loading trucks and shipping containers, and unloading supplies. Groups enjoy staying overnight in the dormitory that sleeps 32 and has a beautiful fully equipped kitchen, laundry facilities, and community room. R.V. camping is available for those wishing to stay in their motor homes or fifth-wheel campers.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES *(continued)*

A motion was made to accept the Treasurer's report and pay the bills as presented. It was seconded and carried. The report from the investment committee was reviewed and discussed.

The parsonage flooring is complete. The replacement of the parsonage garage door opener is scheduled. Damage to windows in the north sanctuary was discussed. The Board would like to see if there is any justification for an insurance claim. Dale Cox is to get a glass company to provide an estimate to repair the windows with holes and cracks. The Trustees viewed the condition of the stained glass windows in the Chapel. The glass pieces are loose and no longer sealed. Janet Bell will meet with a Jacksonville company that repairs stained glass and will report at the next Trustees meeting regarding repair options and costs. The Trustees approved the installation of a humidifier to help keep the piano in tune.

Three facility usage requests were presented and approved. Status of the bidding for snow removal was discussed. A motion to sign the lease of mineral rights for the in White County and the Wade and Dowland copier maintenance agreement was made, seconded and carried.

Pastor Bill has put together a group and will schedule them to inspect the parsonage prior to the Charge Conference scheduled for November 4th. A motion was for the Trustees to contribute \$5000 to the 2008 General Fund budget to be made in installments. The motion was seconded and carried.

The September Gordley report was reviewed. Due to Gordley Committee guidelines, the Trustees were unable to approve the \$300 donation to fire victims, as no bank account was set up for the deposit. A motion was made to redirect those funds to the Virginia Needy Children's Fund. The motion was seconded and carried.
